**Borschak** (Borshchak), Elie (Il'ko), born 19 July 1892 at Kherson, Ukraine, he was an historian who spent most of his adult life in France, writing extensively in both French and Ukrainian, primarily on eighteenth century Ukraine and Franco-Ukrainian relations. His writings include *Huit mois à la Santé, journal, 1940-41* (1946), and *La Légende historique de l'Ukraine* (1949). He died in Paris, 11 October 1959. LC

**Borshchevskii**, IUri Efimovich, born 20 January 1924 at Petrograd, he was an Iranist by training but with interests far beyond that, or any, discipline. His entire career was spent in the Institute of Oriental Studies of the Academy of Sciences. He was joint author of *Книга о простаках Дахо-наме* (1968), and *Персидские миниатюры XIV-XVII вв.* (1968). In 1960 he edited *Джахан-наме*, by Bakran. **Borthwick**, Bruce Maynard, born 2 May 1938 at Port Jefferson, N.Y., he was a graduate of Syracuse University and received a Ph.D. in 1965 from the University of Michigan for his thesis, *The Islamic sermons as a channel of political communication in Syria, Jordan and Egypt*. In 1964 he started a teaching and administrative career in the Department of Political Science, Albion (Mich.) College, a post which he still held in 1998. He wrote *Comparative politics of the Middle East* (1980). AmM&WS 13 (1978); LC; NatFacDr, 1995-1998

**Bosc**, Robert, fl. 1974, he was affiliated with the Institut catholique de Paris. His writings include *La Société internationale et l'Église* (1961-68), *Sociologie de la paix* (1965), *Le Tiers monde dans la politique internationale* (1967), and *Guerres froides et affrontements de 1950 à 1980* (1973). **Bosch**, Gulnar H. née Kheirallah, born 31 October 1909 at Lake Preston, S.D., she graduated in 1929 from the Art Institute, Chicago, and received a Ph.D. in 1952 in Oriental languages from the University of Chicago for her thesis, *Islamic book-bindings; twelfth to seventeenth centuries*. In 1941 she began a teaching career in history of art at a variety of American colleges. With Guy Petherbridge she wrote *Islamic bindings and bookmaking; a catalogue of an exhibition* (1981). **Bosch Vilá**, Jacinta, born 14 April 1922 at Figueras, Spain, he studied at Barcelona and Madrid and took doctorates in philosophy and law. He was a professor of Arabic and Islamic institutions at various Spanish universities. His writings include *El Oriente arabe en el desarrollo de la cultura Marca Superior* (1954), and *Historia de Sevilla; la Sevilla islamica* (1984). He died 18 November 1985. **Boscheinen**, Hans, fl. 1959, he was affiliated with Dresdner Bank, Hamburg. Note

**Bose**, Basanta Coomar, born 19th cent., his writings include *Conquest of Bengal* (1926), and *Mahomedanism* (1931) LC

**Bose**, Fritz, born 26 July 1906 at Stettin, Germany, he received a Dr.phil. in 1935 from the Universität Berlin for his thesis, *Die Musik der Uitoto*. Thereafter he was a department head at the Institut für Lautforschung and its successor, the Institut für Musikforschung, Berlin. His writings include *Lied der Völker, die Musikplatten des Instituts für Lautforschung an der Universität Berlin; Katalog* (1936), and *Musikalische Völkerkunde* (1953). Since 1963 he was an editor of *Jahrbuch für musikalische Volks- und Völkerkunde*. He died in Berlin, 16 August 1975. DIBE; Kürschner, 1940/41-1970; *Wer ist wer*, 1969/70

**Bose**, Swadesh R., Dr., fl. 1963, he was in 1971 an economist at the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, Karachi, and in 1973 an acting director of the Bangladesh Institute of Development Economics. He was joint author of *The Pakistan export bonus scheme* (1963), and *Some basic considerations on agricultural mechanization in West Pakistan* (1969). In 1970 he edited *Studies on fiscal and monetary problems*. LC

**Bosis**, Adolfo de, born in 1863 at Ancona, Italy, he was a poet who settled in Roma in his youth and lived there until his death in 1924. CIDMEL, 1947; LC; Master (1)

**Boškov**, Vančo, born 8 January 1934 at Negotino, Macedonia, he studied Arabic and Turkish at Sarajevo University, and thereafter was affiliated with the National Archives, Skopje. He was a sometime assistant in Turkish literature at Sarajevo, before being appointed in 1980 professor at Skopje University. He died in 1984. The commemoration volume, *Osmanistische Studien zur Wirtschafts- und Sozialgeschichte in memoriam Vančo Boškov* (1986), contains an obituary by H. G.Majer. LC

**Bošković**, Đurđe, born 11 April 1904 at Beograd, he was affiliated with the Archaeological Institute, Beograd. His writings include *L'Art médiéval en Serbie et en Macédoine* (1948), *Arhitektura srednjeg veka* (1957
