Report on the Trade of Tangier and District for the Year 1904

By MR. ACTING-CONSUL WYLDBORE SMITH.

(Tangier, May 31, 1905; received at Foreign Office, June 6, 1905.)

The year 1904 was a bad one for trade in general in this Con- Introduction.
sular district, with the exception of Tetuan, where there was a slight increase on the trade of the preceding year.

The total aggregate value of the export and import trade at the ports of Tangier, Larache and Tetuan amounted during the year under review to 1,227,137*l.* as compared with 1,784,748*l.* in 1903, a decrease of 557,611*l.*

The two main causes for this depression were the disturbed state of the neighbouring district, which resulted in the road between Tangier and Fez being so insecure that merchants were unable to send goods by this road to Fez at any time of the year, and the fact that the harvest of 1904 was a failure for the second year in succession; these two factors tended to decrease the purchasing power of the native population.

The following table shows the percentage of trade of the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Austria-Hungary and Spain at the port of Tangier during the year 1904 as compared with the average of the previous five years:— Tangier.

It will be seen from the above table that British trade in 1904 Imports.
fell below that of the five years' average. British.

It must, however, be borne in mind that British trade, on account of its staple imports being those which are most in native demand, such as cotton goods, candles, tea, &c., depends almost more than that of any other nation on the native consumption and on the Fez market, both of which sources of prosperity for British import trade were greatly diminished for the reasons above-mentioned and also owing to the state of anarchy existing throughout the year 1904 in the Tangier district, which caused the price of food to rise to such a degree that the native population had little or nothing to spend, except on the bare necessities of life.

French. French imports, on the other hand, which it will be noticed have risen considerably during the year, do not, with the exception of sugar and flour, which are necessary to the natives for food, depend so largely on the native consumption, such for example as building material, earthenware, groceries, hardware, wine, &c., and under these headings French trade has flourished.

During the year 1904 the influx of French subjects to Tangier was considerable, the result being a large demand for French goods.

German. The increase in German imports is due to the large amount of cheap cloth imported, which, owing to the impecunious state of the natives, was in much greater demand than the more expensive British material.

Italian. The comparatively high prices at which imports under the Italian flag stood at the end of 1904 are due to the success obtained by the Italian millers, who managed to place flour on this market at a lower price than the French.

Exports. The same causes which accounted for the falling-off in the import trade affected to a much greater extent the exports.

The principal articles of exports at this port are cattle, eggs, wax, dates, fowls, goat-skins and slippers, for all of which, with the exception of the two last-named items, merchants are dependent on the surrounding district, the rebellious state of which resulted in the supply of the staple exports being enormously diminished.

Openings for trade. The following suggestions, some of which were made in my previous report, may be worth the consideration of merchants, with a view of opening up new channels in, or furthering, British trade.

Furniture. With the steady influx of Europeans to this port a great demand under the heading of furniture has already begun. Cheap, light furniture, such as stained wood, bamboo or basketwork goods are in great demand.

Flour. Owing to the failure of the harvest, and the withdrawal of the Sultan's permission for coastwise trade, there is a great and increasing demand for flour and especially semolina. French and Italian millers are reaping a rich harvest in which British millers might have a good share.

Tiles and bricks. If British potters could, by means of sailing vessels or otherwise, arrange cheap freights, they would certainly be able to compete favourably in this market.

At present tiles and bricks in use here are mostly of French origin; the average price for roofing tiles is between 2*l.* 15*s.* and 3*l.* per 1,000 f.o.b. Marseilles. Bricks, 5 centims. thick, are 1*l.* 6*s.* and 1*l.* 7*s.* per 1,000 f.o.b. Marseilles.

There is an increasing demand from the United States for goat-Goat-skins. skins. These skins are said to be of a very fine quality and I would again recommend British tanners to give them a trial.

The rates of exchange of Spanish currency into sterling remained Exchange. at high rates, as the accompanying table will show, throughout the year 1904. Coupled with this, the Moorish in connection with Spanish currency has suffered violent fluctuations:—

This high rate of exchange for Spanish currency and the fluctuations in the value of Moorish coin may have caused payments by natives to be delayed.

To give an example, European goods are sold in this country, being paid for in Moorish coin; this coin must be converted into Spanish currency at a loss, which, during 1904, varied from 6½ to 23½ per cent.; the Spanish currency must again be converted into sterling with a further loss, which, during 1904, amounted on an average to about 40 per cent. In spite of this, however, and although payments may have been delayed on account of the high rate of exchange, public credit was good and suspensions and failures few. Public credit.

Shipping.
General.

The shipping at the port of Tangier, as the accompanying table shows, has increased considerably during the year 1904 :—

The above figures are exclusive of yachts and entries from other Moorish ports.

The number of steam vessels entered is ⁷/₁₀ greater than in any previous year, while the entries of sailing vessels (for the most part small fishing faluchos, and therefore unimportant) are fewer. The total aggregate shows an increase of 146 vessels in the entries and of 158,354 tons over those of the preceding year.

The countries mainly responsible for this increase are the United Kingdom and France, and to some extent also Italy.

The following table shows the proportion of the shipping of the various nations during the last five years :—

British.

The considerable increase in British shipping during the past year is mainly responsible for the large number of total entries at this port mentioned above.

The company chiefly accountable for this increase is that of Messrs. A. Mateos and Sons of Gibraltar, who, as was mentioned in the trade report for this district for 1903, inaugurated a regular service between Gibraltar and Tangier three times a week. This service has been regularly maintained during the whole of the year 1904.

Messrs. M. H. Bland and Co., Limited, of Gibraltar, in addition to their regular service of steamers between Tangier and Gibraltar, despatch their Saturday steamer from Gibraltar, on its arrival at Tangier, to Tetuan, from which port it returns in time to resume its service from Tangier to Gibraltar on Monday morning. This same company, and likewise that of Messrs. A. Mateos and Sons of Gibraltar, each maintain a steamer to ply between Gibraltar and

Laraiche viâ Tangier as often as there is sufficient cargo, and the state of the weather will allow of the Laraiche bar being navigable.

The steamers of Messrs. Forwood Brothers entered 48 times last year as against 46 times during 1903, whilst those of the Papayanni Steamship Company made 23 entries, one less than in the preceding year.

The shipping returns under the Spanish flag call for no special Spanish. comment. The total number of entries was less by 74 than during the year 1903, although the tonnage was much greater. The decrease in the number of vessels is accounted for by the fact that fewer sailing ships visited the port. As has been said before the majority of these sailing vessels are merely small fishing faluchos which put in for refuge.

The regular companies whose ships serve this port have maintained their respective services without alteration.

The shipping returns under the French flag have increased French. considerably during the year under review. A new line of steamers, belonging to the Société Générale de Transports Maritimes à Vapeur of Marseilles, began to visit this port in July, 1904. They run twice a month and have alternate itineraries, viz. (1) Marseilles, Barcelona or Valencia, Tangier, Canaries (for coal if necessary), Santos, Montevideo and Buenos Ayres, returning viâ Montevideo, Canaries and Tangier to Marseilles; and (2) Marseilles, Barcelona or Valencia, Tangier, Canaries (for coal), Montevideo and Buenos Ayres, returning viâ Montevideo, Santos, Rio Janeiro, Bahia, Dakar, Canaries and Tangier to Marseilles.

The steamers of Messrs. N. Paquet et Cie. of Marseilles, and those of the Compagnie de Navigation Mixte, also of Marseilles, made 36 entries respectively. The steamers of the former company came from Marseilles to Tangier on their way to the Western Morocco ports, while those of the latter firm ply between Marseilles, Algiers, Oran, Malaga, Melilla, Gibraltar, Tangier and back to Marseilles viâ Melilla, Oran and Algiers.

The Société Navale de l'Ouest of Paris sent four steamers, which touched here on their way from Antwerp, Havre and Lisbon, to the other Morocco ports and Marseilles.

German shipping is in very much the same position as in the German. preceding year, there being 59 entries with 69,390 tons as compared with 55 entries with 59,045 tons during 1903, the increase in 1904 being due to the arrival of 6 colliers for the Russian fleet in October, 1904. The representative companies were the Oldenburg Portugiesische Dampfschiffs Rhederei of Oldenburg, which sent 29 vessels, the Deutsche Ost Afrika Linie of Hamburg and the North German Lloyd of Bremen, each of which sent 5 vessels; and the R. Sloman, Junr., Line, of Hamburg, whose vessels made 12 entries.

A new line of steamers, the Italo Spagnuola Line of Genoa, under Italian. the Italian flag was instituted during 1904. These steamers, which have bi-monthly sailings, made 27 entries during the year, the route

being from Genoa viâ Marseilles, Barcelona, Malaga, Ceuta, Melilla, Tetuan and Gibraltar, the return journey to Genoa being alternately viâ Lisbon and the Spanish coast, and viâ the Moorish coast ports, Gibraltar and Spanish ports. The Ligure Brasiliana was unrepresented in 1904.

Austro-Hungarian.

Shipping under the Austro-Hungarian flag has maintained its position of the previous year, 25 steamers of the Royal Hungarian Sea Navigation Company Adria, Limited, of Fiume, having called here, being one more than in 1903.

Dutch.

The Dutch shipping returns show only 9 vessels entered this port during the year under review as compared with 14 vessels the year before, the reason being that owing to the increased facilities rendered by the service of steamers of Messrs. Bland and Co. and of Messrs. A. Mateos and Sons for conveying cargo to Tangier and the Morocco coast ports, the Dutch steamers prefer to tranship their cargo at Gibraltar, and thus avoid having to come across to Tangier, and the often somewhat difficult and slow process of unloading at this port.

TETUAN.

Mr. Vice-Consul Bewicke reports as follows :—

The subject that calls for most remark this year is the great ^{Steamers.} increase in steamers calling here, which is practically driving the small sailing vessels from the port.

The number of vessels entered amounted to 207, with a tonnage ^{Tonnage.} of 38,557 tons, being an increase of 44 vessels and 12,996 tons as compared with 1903.

It seems probable that 1905 will show a further increase, as since the new year two other French lines have commenced calling, and a small Spanish steamer is announced for coast trade.

The exports have, however, practically all fallen to the vessels ^{Exports.} of Bland and Co., Limited, which made 60 calls, the French steamers taking very little and the Italian nothing.

The exports have been larger than I have ever known them ; though, of course, this is partly due to the road to Tangier being still practically closed ; it is no doubt also a proof that trade grows with increased opportunities.

The high prices ruling for cottons, sugar, &c., and high exchange, ^{Imports.} hindered import business ; an increase may therefore be looked for this year unless the crops turn out badly.

The presence of a certain number of troops here for the greater part of the year increased consumption but most of them have now left.

LARAICHE

Mr. Vice-Consul Forde reports as follows :—

The general trade of this port during the year 1904 compares General trade. favourably with the last few years, although it was expected that, owing to the revolutionary state of the country and the interrupted communications between Fez and Tangier, the trade of this port would rise to an importance not to be compared with 1903.

The great scarcity, and the rebellious state of the tribes since Imports. the beginning of last year, have obliged the Fez and Mequinez merchants to reduce the large orders for goods from Europe.

The bad crops in the regions of Laraiche and Fez, and the cessation of cultivation in the Gharb for fear of attacks from the Beni Hassen people, have greatly influenced the import of wheat and barley from the coast, increasing the coasting trade in 1904 to 243,882*l.* against 106,735*l.* in 1903.

Owing to the price having risen in cotton goods the Fez, Mequinez, Cotton goods. Alcazar and Wazzan merchants were obliged to countermand important orders they had made, and although the prices of raw cotton have gone down manufacturers cannot reduce the price on account of the large demands from Egypt and India. The receipt of cotton goods—nearly all from the United Kingdom—was less by 867 bales, valued at 95,160*l.*; the quality of British goods, as also the choice of colours in muslins, prints, &c., continue to be much superior to the coarse articles formerly used.

French sugar is still preferred, but is losing ground every Sugar. year; Austro-Hungarian sugar is steadily increasing its contributions, and there were some 651 cwts. imported more than 1903. A good deal of sugar was also imported from the North of France (Chantenay).

Last year there were some 2,600 cwts. of flour, worth 1,300*l.*, Flour. imported from Itlay. The Italian flour is at present preferred to the French.

The exports in 1904 were 46,803*l.* more than in 1903. The in- Exports. crease was due to the large amount of slippers, hides and goat-skins brought from Fez for shipment to Tangier, thence to France, Alexandria and Dakar.

The export of wool, although only 1,160 cwts. more than in 1903, Wool. was very profitable to buyers.

Although there were 62 steamers and sailing vessels entered Shipping. last year more than in 1903, the tonnage did not increase owing to the large steamers going to Gibraltar to discharge the Laraiche cargo. The coasting trade between Tangier and Laraiche has risen to such importance that there is almost daily communications with that port.

Ploughing commenced on a large scale in October. Rain has Agriculture. been copious and beneficial to agriculture. The prospects of a good crop has partly subdued the agitation and robbery in this district.
